**S**OLITAIRE of Mac's Welton, imported last spring from Scotland by Mr. and Mrs. Macaulay, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is well on his way to the title, and has his two major wins. He was Best of Breed and second in the Terrier group at Denver and repeated at Grand Rapids. His latest win was Best of Winners at the Louisville Specialty—a four pointer. The Macaulays consider him one of the top dogs of the country and say he can hold his own in any competition. They are also well pleased with Solitaire's puppies, particularly some five months old youngsters that show great promise. Another of the Macaulays' Scot-ties that is on her way is the eleven-months-old Pixie Bairn who was Winners Bitch at Denver and Grand Rapids. She is by Tweed ex Pixey.

The Harry Haylor's Haycliff Kennels have moved to Hudson, Ohio, and the new kennel is a sizeable one, containing a modern kitchen and kennel man's quarters. It is insulated and radiant heated. It houses 25 dogs. The Haylor's plan to be back showing in the near future. In the past years they owned many champions including Airedales and Fox Terriers.

At the recent Alexandria, La., show, Dr. Fayette C. Ewing brought out his lovely Scotch Thistle of Nosegay and she won both the American-bred and Limit class, splendid for a seven-months-old youngster. Also appearing for the first time was Tam Lin Traveller who went through to Winners. He is owned jointly by Thomas D. Johnson and R. D. Linton. Both Scotch Thistle and Traveller are sired by Ch. Sahib of Nosegay, owned by Mrs. Louise Stahlman of Texas.

Ronald C. Chang of Honolulu, owner of Edgerstoune High-Hat, who placed Best of Breed and Best Terrier at the recent Hawaiian Dog Fanciers' Sanction show, writes that the Scottish Terrier is rapidly regaining its former position as one of the leading breeds of the Islands. There are more Diehards being shown than any other Terrier breed.

Some two years ago, Ch. Edgerstoune Benefactor, owned by Keith P. Rogers, Pembroke, N. H., was sent out to the

West Coast for a time. While there he was used as a stud for a bitch, owned by the Glenwood Kennels, New Westminster, B. C., Canada. From this litter have already come two American champions and a third is well on its way. The two champions are Glenwood Ben Lomand, Best of Breed just recently under Mrs. Matthews for five points, and Ch. Glenwood Tam O'Shanter II. The latter is

ence Little judging. The Winners Dog, Mrs. Winant's Rigadoon Jimminy went through to Best of Breed and second in the group. Ch. Kinclaven Lucky Parcel, owned by Mrs. Constable, was Best Opposite. The bitch points went to Mr. and Mrs. Fred Phillips' Kingston War Baby.

Just 11 entered at the Chester Valley show held at Newtown Square, Pa., on October 5th. Warspite was Best of Breed and second in the group and Ayerscot Agile was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite. Winners Dog was Sheffscot Selectman.

While the entry was small (only 7) at the Rochester, N. Y., show, the Chas. C. Stalters' Ch. Barberry Knowe Rufus held up the banner for the breed by winning a good Terrier group. It was a field day for the Stalters as they had all the top wins. Their Barberry Knowe Betty was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite and their Barberry Knowe Hornet got the dog points.

Jamaica, L. I., on October 19th also had a small entry—5—and here Ch. Deephaven Warspite went through to place Best Terrier. Sheffscot Kennels' Sheffscot Spice was Best Opposite and Best of Winners was Deephaven Kennels' Deephaven Citation. Mrs. Wm. Constable judged.

Thomas Keator judged an entry of 9 at the Back Mountain K. C. show at Kingston, Pa., on October 26th. The Stalters again took all top honors with the same trio which won at Rochester. At Kingston, Ch. Barberry Knowe Rufus was second in the group.

The Elizabeth, N. J., show had a nice entry of 13, A. L. Zeckendorf judging. Ch. Deephaven Warspite was second in the group, with C. H. Werber, Jr.'s Marlu Dark Mischief taking bitch points and Best Opposite. Sheffscot Selectman was Winners Dog.

There were two shows held in the Washington area on consecutive days—the Rock Creek event at Spencerville,

Md., on October 18th had an entry of 16, and the next day the National Capital show at Chevy Chase, Md., had 18 entered. The judges were Wm. Auckland and A. W. Brockway. The T. H. Sneathens' Ch Shieling's Master Key was Best in Show at both events. Winners Bitch at both shows was L. Bradford Branner, Jr. and Bruce Webb's Shenscot Gabie Ella and she placed Best Opposite at Rock Creek. At this same show, the Sneathens' Shieling's Play Boy was Best of Winners. The next day at the National Capital, the Heywood R. Hartley's Ch. Woodhart, Wendy was Best Opposite and their Woodhart Watchman was Best of Winners.

Coming to the Mid-West, a check of the catalogues we have on hand reveals quite small entries. The Grand Rapids, Mich., show only had 5, Heywood Hartley judging. The Wm. J. Macaulays had both the winners. Their Solitaire of Mac's Welton was Best of Breed and second in the group, and their Mac's Welton Pixey's Bairn was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite.

The next day at the Progressive Dog Club show held in Detroit, only 4 entered, E. T. Adair judging. Paisley Hill Kennels' Paisley Hill Henryette was Winners Bitch, Best of Breed and fourth in the group and Lallan Kennels' Kinclaven Ballyhoo Winners Dog and Best Opposite.

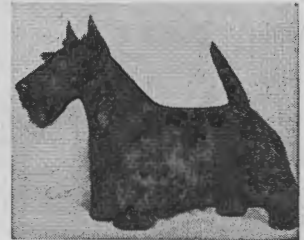

Bred ten champions; imported many British Winners, including six British Champions.

Wrote, and published The Book of the Scottish Terrier, 1931, now in second edition and third printing, and an Anniversary Edition contemplated; acknowledged on two continents to be the Standard book of the breed.

Was elected Arms Bearer and Honorary President of the Scottish Terrier Club of Scotland (instituted 1888), an honor never before conferred upon an American, in recognition of the Nosegay service to the breed (as "FATHER of the SCOTTISH TERRIER in AMERICA," and called "the Dean of the Scotty Fancy") and of the importation of thousands of dollars worth of Scotties into this country.

## Diehard Dope

By R. D. Linton

THE Scottish Terrier Club of America has completed revision of its rules under which its annual specials will be awarded in 1948, to club members only.

Competition is required between two or more entries owned by different persons in order to have points credited in these competitions, and all the owners of a dog must be club members, if it is jointly owned, to have a win count.

As was reported last month, regional trophies will be presented. I am now informed that these will be of a value of \$25 each.

The procedure to be followed in crediting points toward these puppy and American-bred trophies where the A.K.C. point rating varies between the dog and bitch entries, I am informed, will be as follows:

If, for example, the show was only two points in dogs but three in bitches, the winner of the puppy dog and American-bred dog class would be credited (if conditions of competition and ownership were complied with) with only two points, unless the winners dog went best of winners. In this case, the higher point rating would prevail.

If a dog is jointly owned and one of the persons is not a resident of the region in which it is exhibited, I am informed the dog nevertheless would obtain points toward a regional trophy.

All club trophies will be offered, I am informed, at all A.K.C. point shows, regardless of location, but in accordance with the regional rules, as published last month.

Mrs. Robert M. Church, vice-president of the Hawaiian Scottish Terrier Club has brought over a real "Flying Scotsman" to Honolulu to have her family. Walsing Wally of Severna has five transcontinental flights in her air log before taking off from Los Angeles and leaving the Kenbrick Kennels of Mr. and Mrs.
