MAURICE POLLAK, who has served as a director or officer of the Scottish Terrier Club of America for thirteen years in succession has notified the Nominating Committee that he does not wish to be considered for renomination this year. Mr. Pollak states that pressure of other affairs will make it difficult for him to attend meetings regularly and he is convinced that if one is to serve the best interests of the breed, regular attendance is necessary. With the exception of this year Mr. Pollak has attended practically every meeting during his long years of service. He also states "I believe it better to have someone else on the Board in order to get some new blood on it." We hope that the "new blood" will be as faithful as Mr. Pollak has been.

According to this release, this association has recently been formed, its interest primarily being in problems more or less technical in nature and associated with the breeding and exhibiting of Scottish Terriers. Qualifications for membership are broad and "Any person interested in and favorably disposed toward the object of this organization is eligible for membership. Carnation's Ch. Reimill Radiator was Winners at the last Victoria show, bowing to Capers to finish for his Canadian title, so now he has the dual championship. Carnation Chorus Girl, Winners Bitch at the Specialty in Washington, went from Open to Best of Breed at the Portland P. I. show.

Connaughton Farm Kennels of Beaham, Minn., are another kennel which have become very interested in Wicannos. They own five daughters of Ch. Kinclaven Classic and from one of these, Connaughton's Touch of Frost, they got some beautiful wheaten by Ch. Deephaven Citation. They kept two of the wheaten bitches and her brindle sister to add to their breeding stock. The Connaughtons own thirty-five champion-linebred Scotties and have every reason to be proud of their line-up. They tell us that recently two people, to whom they had sold puppies, wrote them that their puppies had been killed by snakes and Mr. Connaughton makes a special plea that dog owners be careful of their dogs. We certainly echo his plea.

In these days of heavy traffic and speeding autos no dog is safe if allowed to run at large. It is a temptation of course to let a dog follow his natural inclinations and roam about investigating fascinating smells and greeting his canine friends—but it is dangerous and lacking a fenced yard—which is the best thing of all for a dog-owner to have—you had better take your dog out on leads or at least go out with him. And even if you are with him, be careful, for dogs, like

children, can dart in front of an auto before you can catch your breath. The number of beloved dogs which are killed by autos each year is appalling and in many instances the drivers are not responsible. While there are a few callous fiends who would not avoid killing a dog even if they could, they are truly in the minority. It is up to we dog owners to protect our dogs—this should not be left to the drivers on our highways.
