TED BENNETT of Deephaven Kennels, Minneapolis, Minn., reports the death of the great Heather Asset. He had been deaf for sometime and lately his eyesight had failed rapidly. Heather Asset was whelped February 23, 1937, and was by Ch. Heather Beau Ideal out of Heather Honeysuckle. Mr. Bennett purchased him from James Chapman, Glenboig, Scotland, when he was eleven months old. He was neither shown nor used at stud in Scotland, but in this country he set up an impressive record, siring fourteen Champions with the fifteenth well on the way. Asset's name also appears as grandsire or great grandsire in many of today's champion.

Deephaven have just finished another champion, Deephaven Citation. He was shown exclusively in the East by John Goudie, and took his final points at Camden. He was Best of Winners at Morris and Essex at eleven months and his latest triumph was at the Chicago Specialty on November 23rd, where he was Best of Breed. He is sired by Deephaven Red Seal and is out of a homebred bitch, Deephaven Daisy May.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Maryland had a nice Match show in October with 19 entries. Dr. Pope's Philabeg Gavin was Best of Breed and Gavin's daughter, Philabeg Spar, Best Opposite.

The Chicago Specialty

The Scottish Terrier Club of Chicago had a grand entry for its Specialty show November 23rd, with an entry of 55—one more than the entry at the spring Specialty of the S. T. C. A. Turk Humphrey of Memphis judged the Puppy Sweepstakes, which had an entry of 17, and Clint Schenck of Powell, Ohio, judged the regular classes.

Best in Show went to Ted Bennett's Deephaven Citation, a dog, one of three "Specials Only" entries. Winners Dog (4 points) was Ernest Joresco's wheaten, Bramshire Blazing Son. The Wm. J. Macauley's import, Solitaire of Mac's Welton was Reserve. Wm. Moore took Best of Winners and Best Opposite for five points, with Kinclaven Ingenué. Reserve was Paisley Hill Kennels' Paisley Hill Proud.

Bob Stewart, the Club President, captured the Puppy Sweepstakes, which totaled \$158.00 in money, with his bitch, Killshandra, bred by Mrs. Shirley Sauer, Sauer, the Club Secretary.

The Club is already making plans for its 1948 show and early in the year will begin publication of a monthly bulletin, offered free to any interested breeder.

WERBER SHOWS SCOTTIE.

Elizabeth, N. J., Nov. 2--(AP)--Charles H. Werber, Jr., President of the Scottish Terrier Club of America, today began showing Scottish Terriers again for the first time in more than 7 years.

Mr. Werber made his return to the ranks of Diehard fanciers with a year-old bitch, Marlu Dark Mischief, obtained from Maurice Pollak, that had placed first in a class of four 6-to-9 puppy bitches at the S.T.C.A. spring specialty, then, with her sister, Marlu Larkspur, won for Ch. Deephaven Warspite the stud-dog class.

The next day, at Morris & Essex, Mischief was first in a class of five. She is out of Marlu Miss Heather, and she is by Ch. Heather Criterion ex Ch. Marlu Miss Personality.

After going reserve winners at Elizabeth, Binghamton and Philadelphia, Mischief got two points and went Best of Winners and Best of Opposite Sex at Camden, then picked up two more points at Newark, where she was again Best of Opposite Sex. She is being handled by John Murphy of Camel advertising fame. John forgot to tell me whether she smokes them, too.

The last time I saw a Werber Scot in the ring was at Morris & Essex in 1940 (the year of the deluge) where his son did a bang-up job of showing. Jean's

Lassie of Jepeca, bred by Mr. and Mrs. Werber.

Newark, judged by Edward Danka, had a small entry—three dogs and six bitches present, with one special, the Charles C. Stalters' Ch. Barberry Knowl Rufus, which went Best of Breed.

Since New Year's resolutions are customary at this time, I'm offering some for the consideration of Diehard fanciers.

First on the list I suggest we all resolve to exhibit better dogs in 1948 and to quit trying to make mediocre dogs champions. In the East in 1947 I've seen dogs started on their way to titles that were nothing but pet-stock calibre—and none too good pet-stock stuff at that.

Regardless of whether a dog is a champion, you can't breed good stuff from bad, and I think we should all remember that fact.

Second, I suggest we all re-examine our ideals and our conception of what constitutes a top Scot. I know that the Standard has finally been whittled away until it seems almost meaningless to me, with what once were considered serious faults omitted entirely or so toned down as to appear in it mere minor weak points that may well be disregarded, but I believe we should all remember that changing the Standard isn't going to improve our dogs.

Third, I suggest we all remember that a Scot that is built right will move right and that we all resolve to pay more attention to gait in 1948.

While a Scottish Terrier is not expected to have the free flowing movement of a greyhound, the right sort of Diehard does have a free and easy movement. He doesn't tipe toe along like a caterpillar.

Let's not be taken in by mere appearance standing still.

Showing your dogs, even puppies, does pay. Take the case of Mrs. Jean Matthews of Relgalf fame. This fall she has been exhibiting fearlessly throughout the South and Southwest—and incidentally letting fanciers in these sections see what some good Scots look like.

As a result, she picked up some 47 points toward the Scottish Terrier Club of America Lloyd Best of Breed trophy, running her total for the year to 97 points, and appears likely to win it again with Ch. Relgalf Rebel Leader which during the year piled up 25 Best of Breeds, 20 Group and 7 Best in Show wins. And by showing some puppies and young stock, Mrs. Matthews also ran up the score of 69 points toward the puppy bitch trophy and 52 for the American-bred bitch award.

Thirty-five members and eight guests attended the annual meeting and dinner at Hampshire House, Boston, and heard an interesting, amusing, and instructive talk on Diehards by James W. Spring, of Newton Center, Mass.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Maryland got out a 3-point entry in dogs—seven—for its specialty held with the Catonsville all-breed show, but only three bitches (1 point). Best of Breed was the winners bitch Shenscot Gabie Ella, owned by L. Bradford Branner, Jr., and Bruce Webb. The Best of Opposite Sex was Merritt N. Pope's Winners Dog, Philabeg Reek II.

The entry the next day at Mason and Dixon was much smaller, three dogs and one bitch. Mrs. Carl H. Stewart, president of the Maryland club, got Best of Breed with her Winners Dog, Mish-abend's Michael. Best of opposite sex was taken by S. G. Ella.

Quaker City, on Labor Day, had four dogs and three bitches. Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Icelow's Cabrach MacGregor III accounted for Winners Dog (2 points) and Best of Breed. Winners Bitch (1 point) and Best Opposite was Silibas Home Girl, owned by Edward R. Quinn.

An extremely small entry—two dogs, five bitches (one absent) and two specials—brought the 1947 show season to a close in the New York district Dec. 7, at the Bronx County Kennel Club event. Benjamin H. Ozias judged.

This was the Bronx club's twenty-sixth show and the first since 1939. There was a total entry of 926.

Miss Julie Sheffield's dog, Sheffscot Selectman, shown for Specials Only was Best of Breed. Best of Opposite Sex was the Best of Winners, Mr. Werber's Marlu Dark Mischief. Winners Dog was the Stalters' Barberry Knowe Hornet. Johnny Murphy had a field day, handling the winners of the limit, open and winners bitch classes, then going best of winners, best of breed and best opposite.

The next day at Camden, Prentice Talmadge judged an entry of 15. Warspite was again Best of Breed and here second in the group and his daughter, Marlu Sassy Lassie was Winners Bitch

and Best Opposite. She is also owned by Mariu Kennels. Deephaven Kennels' Deephaven Citation was Best of Winners.

The Utica and Syracuse, N. Y. shows were held on consecutive days—December 6th and 7th. The placings at both shows were identical. Dr. and Mrs. B. Kater McInnes' Marymac's Master Skylark was Winners Dog and Best of Breed and G. A. Mitchell's Klintilloch Lorelei was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite.

Rebel Leader chalked up another Best in Show at the Columbia, S. C. show on November 17th. There were 21 entered, Rees L. Davies judging. Klintilloch Lorelei was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite, and Marymac's Master Skylark was Winners Dog.
