THE fact that William Singleton, President of the Scottish Terrier Club of England, is judging the Scottish Terrier Club of America February show, offers everyone a great opportunity to have their dogs judged by a breeder who has pioneered in England for many a year. Mr. Singleton is considered one of Great Britain's top judges, and anyone who can possibly make the Specialty show in February, should do so.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Chicago Specialty show (results of which appear elsewhere in the department) was a splendid show and I thoroughly enjoyed talking with the many fanciers and watching Mrs. Constable judge. The consensus of opinion was that she did a very excellent job.

It is interesting to note that four daughters of Marlu Kennels' Ch. Deephaven Warspite finished their championship during 1948. Three were bred by Marlu Farms—Champions Marlu Sassy Lassie, Dark Mischief and Dandy Actress. Dark Mischief is owned by Charles Weber, Jr., President of the Scottish Terrier Club of America, and he personally showed her at the 1948 Westminster event where she was Winners Bitch.

In the show ring, Warspite's place has been taken by Marlu's Ch. Deephaven Red Seal. Although we do not have official records on his wins for the year, we figure he has won three Best in Shows, fourteen groups and better than thirty Best of Breeds. There were two champions in his first litter including Ch. Deephaven Citation. Several of his progeny in the Midwest, as well as in the East, have already won points toward their title, and Marlu are more than enthusiastic about some of his puppies which are now at the kennels being groomed for future shows.

R. J. McLoughlin is planning to breed Ch. Lynnscoth Deborah to Red Seal. Deborah is a top bitch, who won two Specialty shows in a row—Rye in September, 1945, and New York in February, 1946. She is the dam of Ch. Lynscoth Enchantress.

Thanks to Dr. and Mrs. B. Kater McInnes, we can give you the results from the Columbia, S. C., and Augusta, Ga., shows. Charleston was reported last month. At Columbia under Walter Reeves, the McInnes' Marymac's Dixie Leader was Winners Dog and Bruce Webb's Middlemount Tinklebelle Best of Winners. Mr. Webb also had Best of Breed with Ch. Middlemount Piccador. Piccador repeated under Paul Hamer at Augusta. Dixie Leader was Best of Winners and Chareah Wee Lassie owned by Mr. and Mrs. Chas. H. Shorts was Winners Bitch. Mrs. McInnes writes that the Relgalf dogs were sadly missed as they have added much to southern shows in recent years. Ch. Relgalf Rebel Leader having taken several Best in Shows. At the

recent events his name was represented by his winning son, Dixie Leader and his daughter Middlemount Tinklebelle.

Things are going well at the Marymac Kennels. They have twenty-five or more Scotties including four champions, and just now they are much delighted with a litter by Ch. Shieling's Master Key out of a typey daughter of Ch. Relgalf Rebel Dictator ex Ch. Deephaven Variation.
