A note from Wm. J. Macaulay Cedar Rapids, Iowa, brings the good news that his imported Solitaire of Mac's Welton, finished his championship at the Lincoln, Nebr., show. He was Best of Breed here and second in the Terrier Group.

Another new champion is Lynnscoot Enchantress owned by the Robert J. McLoughlins, Allendale, N. J. She finished on the Southern circuit and is a daughter of Ch. Relgalf Rebel Leader out of Ch. Lynnscoot Deborah. She has had a very excellent record, beginning her winning career as a puppy and finishing at 17 months. She is the McLoughlins' second champion.

Dr. Fayette C. Ewing whose kennels were thinned out during the war, but who kept enough to carry on his career (which incidentally extends back to 1897) has been showing three puppies and they show real promise of splendid future careers. The bitch puppy, Nosegay Fly By Night won the American-bred class at Houston, where her litter sister Scotch Mist of Nosegay shown in Limit and Open, went clear through to Best of Winners. At the Scottish Terrier Specialty show held the day before Morris and Essex, Scotch Mist won the Limit class and was second in Open, and another sister, Bobbie Brae of Nosegay was first Novice. At Morris and Essex, Bobbie Brae was second Novice; Scotch Mist again won Limit and was second Open. They repeated their wins at Plainfield. All of these puppies mentioned are from a litter whelped August 22, 1947, bred by Dr. Ewing, and by Ch. Sahib Nosegay out of Half Bob of Nosegay. Both the sire and dam are of predominant Nosegay bloodlines. There were seven in the litter but four died. Dr. Ewing only took two East, leaving Fly By Night at home, since it was inconvenient to ship more than two clear from Louisiana to the East.

Once again the Washington State Scottish Terrier Club is planning a Scottish Terrier show—their fourth licensed event—and it will be held at Kirkland on July 25th, with Ted Bennett judging. Mr. Bennett, known from Coast to Coast for his Deephaven Scotties, has judged such important shows as Los Angeles, Westminster, Skokie, etc. There is no doubt but what this show will offer major points in both sexes.

Last November 2nd, the Scottish Terrier Club of Kentucky was host to a most successful Specialty show, which included a prominent judge and a four point entry. There was a buffet dinner the evening before the show, generously contributed by Club members, Dr. and Mrs. W. Stewart Carter. There was also a splendid trophy list. This year, the date has been tentatively set for October 31st, and the Club hopes to make the

1948 event even better than last year.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Michigan held its second Sanction Puppy Match at Detroit on June 6th, with Albert J. Milne of Canada judging. Best in Show was a four months old puppy, Yankee Pride Laddie owned and bred by Peter Babisch. Best Bitch was Donna owned by Mrs. Anna Cumberland.

Last month, the printer inadvertently dropped Dr. Rogers' name from the Scottish Terrier department heading. We did not notice the omission until it was too late to do anything about it.

## Diehard Dope

NEITHER the Scottish Terrier Club of America spring Specialty nor Morris & Essex the next day produced any surprises as far as Best of Breed was concerned; Marlu Kennels' Ch. Deephaven Warspite, back from an announced "retirement," won them both.

Marlu cleaned up over the week end. Warspite, which placed third in the group at Morris & Essex, was Best of Breed and won the group the next day at Plainfield. Best of opposite sex at all three shows was Marlu Sassy Lassie, winner of the open-bitch class. She picked up 4 points at the Specialty, under Bryce Gillespie of Los Angeles, 4 at Morris & Essex under H. Alvin McAleenan, and 4 under William L. Kendrick at Plainfield.

At the specialty, held May 21 on the Garden City Hotel grounds on Long Island with the American Fox Terrier Club's specialty, five other Marlu entries accounted for a first and three seconds; at Morris & Essex, three other entries collected a second and a fourth, and at Plainfield another entry collected a first.

In the other main award the judges showed considerable disagreement. Mr. Gillespie found his Winners Dog in Edward F. Moloney's Gold Finder's Pilot, American-bred winner, 4 points, and his Reserve in the open-class winner, Mr. and Mrs. Charles C. Stalter's Barberry Knowe Rascal. His Reserve in bitches was Mrs. Arthur Reeg's Blanart Barcarolle, Best Puppy in the Futurity, thereby winning for Kenneth MacBain the stud-dog trophy for his Cabrach Caliper. Best Puppy Dog in the futurity was the Stalters' Barberry Knowe Duplicate that went on to win the Novice class unopposed.

Mr. McAleenan evidently thought the dogs a poor lot, for he found his Winners Dog and Reserve in the puppy class—Mrs. John G. Winant's Edgerstoune MacGlyn, 4 points, and Mrs. Reeg's Blanart Buccaneer, sister to Barcarolle, that was unplaced the day before in the puppy-dog futurity and third in the 9-12 puppy dog class. His Reserve in bitches was also a puppy, the Rev. and Mrs. Williams J. Macaulay's Mac's Welton Miss Betsy.

At Plainfield, Mr. Kendrick made Duplicate, Winners Dog, 2 points, with Robert McGarrity's American-bred winner Sandy McNab, Reserve; Barberry Knowe Rascal won the open class. Miss Betsy again won the puppy class and was Reserve.

East was halted was counteracted by the Plainfield entry. Mr. Gillespie, owner of Bothkennar Kennels, drew a total of 49; Mr. McAleenan, 55, but Mr. Kendrick only 32, made up of 8 dogs (one absent, 19 bitches (two absent) and 5 specials (one absent).

Statistics are tricky things, but a study of the entries and the number actually present in dogs and bitches in the classes—which are the only ones that count for points—in the four top Eastern shows during the last 12 months does show some interesting things, I believe.

The 1947 spring Specialty becomes the base for comparison for the years, and these figures show a steady decline, until the winter Specialty, of bitches entered and present, and of dogs, until the spring shows.

But the 1947 spring shows also showed a slight increase, compared with the preceding year, as the following table shows:

These figures seem to disprove the often voiced statement that poor entries are caused by a poor judge. For example, while Mrs. Constable drew the lowest entry of all in dogs—13 at the 1948 Westminster—there was one more present—12—than were on hand at the 1948 winter Specialty under Mr. Joresco.

The lowest bitch entry and total present were chalked up under Mrs. Winant at the 1947 Morris & Essex—18 and 14, respectively—yet she had 24 dogs entered, with 22 present, only two under the base show.

Mr. Joresco's bitch entry, 31, was the highest of all except that under Mr. Schenck at the 1946 winter Specialty, 33, and the 24 present, 8 more than the base show, likewise was a total greater than any during the last 12 months.

Neither do these facts support the claims that judges from outside the Eastern area are required to draw a good entry and attendance. While the base show was judged by a Chicagoan, Mr. Groves, Mrs. Winant drew only two less across the board at the following Morris & Essex.

Mr. McAleenan drew five more bitches this year, and Mr. Joresco, also of

Chicago, drew only 16 dogs with five absent at this year's winter Specialty, and Mrs. Constable drew a larger bitch entry than Mr. Groves, 27 to 20, but had one less present, 15 to 16.

The low point in entries and attendance in dogs was the 1948 winter Specialty and Westminster, and in bitches the 1947 Morris & Essex show.

This variation seems to indicate that lack of good stock is the main cause of low entries. This is borne out when the 1948 spring exhibitors' roll is studied. While there were only 19 exhibitors at this year's spring Specialty compared with 21 last year, there were six newcomers compared with only two last

year, and the total entry by newcomers was eight, compared with two.

Thus the regular Eastern exhibitors appear to be declining, and to be showing fewer dogs. It will be interesting to see whether these newcomers will remain active or whether they will decide that they are only making points for some one else and drop out.

Mrs. Winant's dog Ch. Edgerstone Pepper, was Best of Breed, and was second in the group at the Ladies Kennel Association show at Garden City May 15. Mrs. Albert Ayres drew an entry of six dogs (three absent), ten bitches (two absent) and four specials (one absent). She found her best of Opposite Sex in her Winners Bitch (3 points) the Stalters' Barberr Knowe Betty from the American-bred class, that went Best of Winners. Winners Dog, one point, was the Stalters' American-bred winner, Barberr Knowe Amber, with Reserve Mrs. Reeg's Blanart Brigadier. Reserve in bitches was Marlu Sassy Lassie, open-bitch winner.

Next day at the Long Island Kennel Club show at Westbury under Alfred Mitchell, Pepper again went Best of

Three shows to report this month—one an upset—and Reimill Black Jane, imported by the Carnation Farms Kennels from Bernard Dittrich, England, continued her winning sweep at two.

Carnation's Reimill Radiator went all the way from open dogs to second in the group at the Inland Empire Kennel Association show at Spokane, April 24 and 25, picking up five points. Mr. and Mrs. John C. Dresden's Silver Thane's Image was Reserve. Only two bitches were entered and Carnation's import Westpark Wildflower collected a point and went Best of Opposite Sex. Mr. and Mrs. Helge N. Anderson's puppy, Sadie's Plaid was Reserve. Mrs. Beatrice Godsol judged.

At the Richland Kennel Club show, May 1, Carnation's Reimill Black Jane beat her kennelmate Radiator for Best of Winners, went on to win the group under Joseph L. Dodds and Best in Show under Reginald H. Livsey, who also did the breed, to finish her championship with five points. Radiator got three points in dogs; Reserve was Mrs. G. Shillinglaw's Kinclaven Clarion. Bitches were also three points, and Reserve went to Peter M. Baum's Blackbriar Begonia.

Fresh from this Best-in-Show triumph, Black Jane came a cropper under Harry Saunders at the Yakima Valley Kennel Club show, May 2, where after going Best of Winners she was defeated for Best of Breed by Mrs. Shillinglaw's Canadian Ch. Mar Jo Brigadier, which placed second in the group, and had to be content with Best of Opposite sex. The same five dogs and six bitches were present, for three points in each sex. Winners Dog was Radiator again, with Reserve going to Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Dresden's Bernadette's Jet Pilot. Reserve in bitches was Blackbriar's Begonia again.

Westpark Windflower and Reimill Radiator are litter brother and sister and were bred by William Medcalf of England. They are by Westpark Masterpiece ex Medwal Musique and were whelped June 15, 1945. Reimill Black Jane was bred by J. L. Deas of England and is by Medwal Matador out of Maigarth Madrigal and was whelped March 10, 1946. Both bitches have whelped and Jane began her show career in this country in October, thus finishing in record time, when the relatively few shows of this district are taken into account.

The club is urging fanciers to combine a vacation in the Pacific Northwest with its specialty July 25 at Kirkland, across the lake from Seattle. Ted Bennett of Minneapolis, owner of Deephaven Kennels, is the judge. The club is working on an even larger trophy list than last year's total of eighteen and is offering to recommend good handlers to any who cannot attend. Last year's show was a five-pointer.
