

A LETTER from Mrs. W. Josten tells us of the arrival of a litter of seven out of her imported Ch. Walsing Wynecola of Hampton Hill and sired by Ch. Walsing Winning Trick of Edgerstoune. Mrs. Josten says she is as excited about this litter as she was years ago when Ch. Wolvey Dream presented Hampton Hill with its first Sealyham litter. May Wynecola prove as great a brood matron in Scotties as Dream did in Seals. It is interesting to note that in this Scotty litter the last puppy arrived thirty six hours after the rest, but was just as healthy and in as good condition.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Kentucky are changing the plans for their Jr. and Sr. Sweepstakes, and this year there will be three age groups—puppies 6 months and under 9; Jr. puppies 9 months and under 12; Sr. puppies 12 months and under 15. If entries are heavy sexes in each age group will be judged separately with the four best puppies of each sex in their respective groups competing for the money awards of that group. There will be no competition between the groups. The Club is adding \$50.00 to the entry fees in each group to make the prize money worthwhile.

In order to compete, final entries in the Sweepstakes must also be entered in the regular classes of the Specialty Show. Already approved is the date of Sunday, October 28th, and there will be two judges—Mr. John Goudie will judge Regular Classes; Mrs. Arthur Reeg the Sweepstake Classes. Nominations for the Sweepstakes will close July 15th. The fee is \$2.00 per nomination; continuing eligibility will close August 31st, fee also being \$2.00. Final entries will close the regular closing date of the show and the final fee is \$1.00 per dog. Rosehall Toryglen Tam O'Shanter, making his debut went from the classes to take the points in dogs and then on to Best in Show All Breeds. Best Opposite was R. A. and Edna Schuller's Ch. It is good to see a Scotty entry owned by Miss Elizabeth Hull back in the show. Her Fashion Sunlight topped the breed at three shows in April on the Virginia circuit.

Ch. Gillis Wrockwardine Sirius owned by the Wishing Well Kennels of Montclair, N. J., now has three championship titles—English, American and Canadian. The latter was acquired in three days in May when Sirius topped the Canadian Specialty show, was Best of Breed and placed in the group the next day at Ottawa, taking his final points with a Best in Show at Hull. A championship in three shows in three days is certainly something to boast about.

Shieling's Stylecraft went through to a second spot in the group to the Best in Show winning Wire, and Stadler's Royal Heiress was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite. 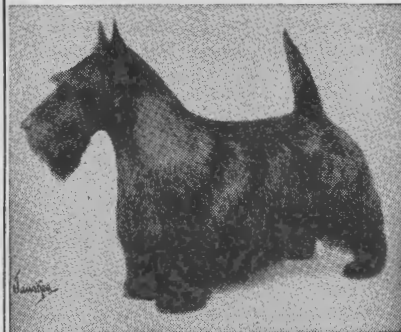
