at the Hammond, Ind., show on April 24,
where she was Winners Bitch for three
points.

For some time Scottie fanciers in Penn-
sylvania have been talking of organizing a
Club and finally the idea crystallized and
the Scottish Terrier Club of Pennsylvania
was born. The first meeting was held in
conjunction with the Philadelphia show
last November, handlers' crates being used
for chairs and tables. Since then the club
has made excellent progress, its member-
ship is steadily growing and they are
planning to hold their first Match show
on June 26 at the Troop Farm, Newton
Square, Pa. Chas. Stalter, who judged at
Westminster this year, will pass on the
Match.

Just got a flash from the Greensboro,
N. C., show (catalogue was missing when
we made up the regular show depart-
ment). Edw. McQuown judged and Mr.
and Mrs. Heywood R. Hartley's Wood-
hart Winsome, entered in American-bred
Bitches, went clear through to Best of
Breed and then on to win the Terrier
Group. The Winners Dog was Dr. and
Mrs. B. Kater McInnes' Marymac's Dixie
Leader. It was a four-point show for both
Winsome and Leader.

Mariglen Kennels' O'Darby Hi-Hope,
which placed Best in Show at Roswell,
New Mexico, in April, has since finished
for the title.

Dr. Fayette C. Ewing, whose Nosegay
Kennels were established in 1887, finds it
just about impossible to retire, even
though he tried to do so a year ago!
Truth of the matter is the Doctor is such
a real Scottie man he finds it difficult to
drop his interest in showing and breeding.
He still has a couple of bitches and also
a couple of young stud dogs. He writes
he plans to keep one of the latter, so he
can breed an occasional litter. Dr. Ewing
has been in ill health for quite a few
years, but in spite of this he manages to
carry on and certainly his interest in the
breed is as keen as ever. Incidentally, he
has several top bitches out on shares—
one with Keith Rogers' MacR Kennels in
New Hampshire, another with Miss Rose
Lee Henderson in Virginia.

2:00 p. m. Entry fee, 50-cents per dog.

THERE were shows galore in April
and early May, with only fair en-
tries for the most part, though there
have been some notable exceptions. Top
entry at any of the shows was at Balti-
more County, where R. D. Linton had
the very excellent entry of 34 and where
the classes were considered the Specialty
Show of the Scottish Terrier Club of
Maryland. At the Old Dominion show
the previous day, there was a good entry
—22—with Wm. Ross Proctor judging.

Virginia Beach, site of the first show
for the Tidewater Kennel Club, brought
out 18, and in the Midwest, Lake Shore,
Cincinnati and Louisville all had rather
sizeable entries. The same was true of
Norman and Tulsa, Okla., and Joplin,
Mo., where there were around 15 at
each of the shows.

The Richland, Wash., event had an
entry of 17 but the big Los Angeles show
—over 1,400 entries—only came through
with 20.

At Joplin, Mo., Robert Matthews'
Dunolly Clansman came from the classes
to Best Terrier, and at Salem, Ore., and
Richland, Wash., class dogs also won the
groups. At Salem it was Edwin Calvert's
Glenwood's Atom Bomb and at Richland,
Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Douglass' Mac's
Welton Melinda. The breeding of the
class dogs is interesting. Dunolly Clans-
man is a homebred by Ch. Deephaven
Red Seal out of Dunolly Mandy. Glen-
wood Atom Bomb is by Ch. Edgerstoune
Benefactor ex Glenwood Sparkling Sal,
bred by the Canadian, Mrs. G. Shilling-
law. Mac's Welton Melinda is by Grifana
Timothy ex Mac's Welton Pixey, bred by
Mac's Welton Kennels.
