Scotties at the Specialty and Westminster

THERE was a terrific amount of interest concerning the Scottish Terrier Club of America's Specialty show held two days before Westminster, for the famous English breeder and judge, Wm. M. Singleton had come over to pass on the breed. He had an entry of 73 and his careful and earnest work in the ring was a pleasure to watch. From a class of 9 Specials, he chose as Best of Breed, Jos. W. Kelly's Ch. In-

dependent Ben. It is rather interesting to note that he placed his Specials 1-2-3-4, as he did in all the regular classes. Second in the Specials lineup was Marlu Farm Kennels' Ch. Deephaven Red Seal, third the Winners Dog which had also gone Best of Winners, Mr. and Mrs. Chas. C. Stalter's Barberry Knowe Amber (a son of Barberry Knowe Revival ex Betty XIII and fourth, Deephaven Kennels' Ch. Deephaven Citation.

Winners Bitch went to Marlu Farm Kennels with Marlu Sheila, a daughter of Edgerstoune Latest Deal ex Strangford Sheila and she was also Best of Opposite Sex. Reserve in dogs was another owned by Marlu Farm Kennels, Marlu Scotch Dandy, a son of Ch. Deephaven Red Seal and Ch. Marlu Milady's Flirt. The Reserve bitch was Marie A. Stone's Kinclaven Careless, a daughter of Bramshire Blaze O'Glory ex Ch. Kinclaven Caprice.

Westminster

At Westminster, Chas. C. Stalter judged and there were 59 entries. Mrs. John G. Winant's Ch. Walsing Winning Trick of Edgerstoune (one bred by Mr. Singleton and consequently not shown under him at the Specialty), was Best of Breed, and later went on to a second spot in a hot Terrier group under Thomas Keator. Best Opposite to Winning Trick was Mr. and Mrs. R. J. McLoughlin's Ch. Lynscot Enchantress.

Mrs. T. H. Snethen's Shieling's Merriment, a daughter of Ch. Shieling's Signature out of Ch. Shieling's Luminous, placed Best of Winners and Edw. F. Moloney's 9-12 mos. Puppy Class Winner, Gold Finder's Admiral was Winners Dog. Admiral is a son of Ch. Deephaven Red Seal out of Gold Finder's Bess. Mr. Moloney had Reserve in dogs with Gold Finder's Pilot, he by Ch. Edgerstoune Spitfire ex Heather Maisie. Marie Stone's Kinclaven Complacence was Reserve Winners Bitch. She is a daughter of Ch. Kinclaven Wild Oats ex Kinclaven Gossip.

More Scottie News

From Martha Merrill of Tacoma, Wash., comes news of the Seattle Kennel Club show held January 22 and 23, with Alva Rosenberg doing the honors of the day. There were 30 Scotties entered—13 dogs, 13 bitches, 2 Specials and 2 for Exhibition Only, making five points in both sexes. There were only four absentees, which was excellent as there was a bad snowstorm the night before the show. Carnation Farms' Ch. Reimill Radiator took Best of Breed and they also had Winners Bitch and Best Opposite with their English import, Westpark Windflower. In dogs, the points went to Miss Evelyn J. Sundell's Mr. Jim-of-Maple-Fair. The Reserves were Mrs. G. Shillinglaw's Can. Ch. Mar-Jo Brigadier and Carnation Farms' Carnation Wee Damsel. Following his Best of Breed win, Radiator went on to win the group and was a good contender for Best in Show.

The Pacific Northwest boasts a new champion—Ch. Blackbriar Begonia, owned by Peter M. Baum of Seattle. She finished at the last Portland show.

WE were sorry to hear that Keith Rogers of the MacR Kennels, Pembroke, N. H., had been hospitalized most of last summer due to a virus infection, eventually necessitating an operation. He is coming along all right now.

Big news at the MacR Kennels is the purchase of Ch. Rigadoon Jimminy. He was Winners Dog at the 1948 Westminster show and is a son of Ch. Heather Commodore out of Edgerstoune Bonnibel, she a Ch. Spitfire—Ch. Latest News daughter. Mr. Rogers plans to show Jimminy quite extensively.

Had a mixup in the January issue reporting the Victoria, B. C. show. Got the two Pym's mixed. It was Walter J. Pym, not Wm. Pym who judged and Best of Winners was Ch. Blackbriar Begonia, not Glenwood Atom Bomb.

Reports from the Florida shows are very incomplete and the Scottie entries, judging from the catalogues we have were very small. The Savannah, Ga., show on January 25th had quite a nice entry of 9 in the classes and one Special—the latter, Tyrus Eugene Hogan's Ch. Loumac's Insigator going Best of Breed. Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Blythe's Aladdin's Bewitcher was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite. Dr. and Mrs. B. Kater McInnes Marymac's Dixie Leader was Best of Winners.

Marie Stone's Kinclaven Andante went clear through to place Best Terrier at the Milwaukee show held on January 16th. This was a grand win for this young dog, as there were 770 dogs entered in the show. Andante is by Ch. Bramshire Blaze o'Glory ex Kinclaven Christina and a homebred.

At the Baltimore, Md., event the first Eastern shows of the year, there was a splendid entry of 25, and Mrs. J. G. Winant's Ch. Edgerstoune Pepper topped the breed under Mrs. Augustas Riggs IV, and later placed third in the Terrier group. Best of Winners and Best Opposite was Mrs. Winant's Edgerstoune Winsome, a seven and a half months old daughter of Ch. Walsing Winning Trick of Edgerstoune ex Ch. Edgerstoune Ophelia. In Dogs Mr. and Mrs. L. Bradford Branner, Jr.'s took Winners with Shenscot Black Ebony, he by Philabeg Gavin ex Shenscot Gabie Ella. The Reserves were Gayclan Kennels' Hudson's Hapy Jack and the R. J. Icelow's Icelow's Lady MacBeth.

Last month Paisley Hills Kennels Scottie and Westie ads were reversed. In other words, the Westie ad appearing in the Scottie department and vice versa. Mine Brook Kim II is the Israel's Scottish Terrier.

How Well Do You Know Your Collies

It is suggested that if one completes this with six errors or less he can begin to consider himself an expert. Self-analysis can be made from the answers. Were errors mainly on same subject? Did your answers lean to severity all the way through or on any one portion? Were you prone to call virtues faults or vice versa? It is admitted that this method must ignore the balance, expression and overall appearance that often is decisive in the ring but it does give a relatively simple method that can be graded and analyzed.
