THE Wm. J. Wheelers of Los Angeles write that their Bothkennar Black Beauty passed away the end of July at the age of 11½ years. She was the dam of two champions—Ch. Bothkennar Babette and Ch. Seaforth Silvertip. Silvertip was quite a sensational show winner until he lost a front tooth in 1946. Black Beauty was retired from breeding five years ago.

Walsing Watch Light finished his English championship at the Aberdeen Championship show in September. He is the second post-war English champion.

At the recent Hawaiian Kennel Club, on September 7 in Honolulu, Count Garthright, owned by Mrs. Robert Church, Vice-President of the Hawaiian Scottish Terrier Club, was Best of Breed and third in the group. He is by Ch. Kinclaven Classic ex Balquidder Spring Folly and was bred by Dr. Boyd Snee. He came from Garthright Kennels of Oregon, Wis. Scotties had the largest entry of any of the Terrier breeds at the Hawaiian show and the Count won five points. Best of Opposite Sex to him was the Winners Bitch, Ronald C. Chang's Edgerstoune High Hat, who needs but a point or two to finish. Reserve in dogs was Josephine P. Helmer's Angus MacDuff, and in bitches, Heide, owned by Lani Jane Chun. Heide is a daughter of Edgerstoune High Hat and was bred by Mr. Chang.

James W. Spring certainly had a nice entry at the Interstate show. There were 25 and James W. Kelly's Ch. Independent Ben, a Specials entry, was Best of Breed and second in the group. Sheffscot Kennels' Sheffscot spice was Best of Winners and the same owners' Sheffscot Selectman was Winners Dog.

Westchester the next day (and a huge show) had 27 entries and Marlu Farm Kennels' Ch. Deephaven Warspite certainly found the going to his liking. He was Best of Breed under Stuart Hardy, Best Terrier under Wm. Ross Proctor and then he strutted proudly on for Best in Show under Jos. P. Sims. This was really a grand win for Warspite, as this show had a total entry of 1612. Best Opposite to him was the Winners Bitch, Mrs. Wm. Constable's Murray Rosenbloom. Best of Winners went to the dog, Sheffscot Selectman.

Somerset Hills held September 13th, found Ch. Deephaven Warspite repeating his Westchester win. Best of Breed under Richard Kerns, Best Terrier under

Stanley Halle and Best in Show under Wm. Ross Proctor. Best Opposite was the Chas. C. Stalters Winning Bitch, Barberry Knowe Victress, which had come from the Puppy class. Best of Winners was Sheffscot Selectman.

took Best of Winners with Edgerstoune Pepper.

A small entry at Bradford, Pa., on September 14th, but Shieling's Master Key owned by the T. H. Sneathens made up for it by going through to Best in Show, winning the breed and top award honors under George Hartman and the Terrier group under John P. Hackett.

At the Springfield, Mass., show, 15 was the entry and Ch. Independent Ben topped the breed and went on to second in the group. Sheffscot Spice was Best Opposite, and Edgerstoune Pepper Best of Winners.

Westbury had 16, really nothing to crow about for a show that had over 1,000 entries. Ch. Deephaven Warspite was Best of Breed; Sheffscot Spice Best of Winners and Best Opposite, and Deephaven Kennels' Deephaven Citation Winners Dog.

For the most part the Midwest entries have been below par, though one or two shows have come through nobly and there have been some nice group wins. The Kinclaven dogs have been absent from recent shows, as Marie Stone has been quite ill and in the hospital for a number of weeks. She is back home now.

Wheeling, W. Va., on August 26th only had 5 entries, but the only class dog entered, Shieling's Master Key not only placed Best of Breed, but went right on through to top the Terrier group under Heywood Hartley, and place Best in Show under Edwin Pickhardt.

Chicago West Suburban show (a 700 dog show) had the largest of the recent Midwest entries—24 and Dr. Frank Booth passed on the breed. Dr. and Mrs. Edw. LaRue's Sparks O'Fire went from the Open dog class to Best of Breed, and the Winners Bitch, Shirley Sauer's Clee Lee Could Be was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite.

At Sandusky, Ohio, Shieling's Master Key now entered for Specials was Best Terrier and he repeated at Lorain. The breed entry here was 12—which is quite good for a 400-dog show. The point winners were Paisley Hill Kennels' Paisley Hill Henryette who was Best of Winners and Best Opposite, and the Sneathens' Shieling's Play Boy.

Ch. Shieling's Master Key won the group at Greenville, Ohio, and Best of Breed at Dayton, in an entry of 13. Here Paisley Hill had Best of Winners and Best Opposite with Paisley Hill Proud and Shieling's Play Boy was again Winners Dog.

Diehard Dope

MRS. JOHN G. WINANT has Mrs W. D. Madden, owner of Glencannie Kennels of England, to thank for the existence of her famous young dog, Eng. Ch. Walsing Winning Trick, now rapidly rounding into top show form at her Edgerstoune Kennels, Concord, N. H.

Mrs. Madden bought a bitch of W. M. Singleton to begin her post-war reconstruction of her kennels. He had none to spare but did have some due to whelp. So he offered Walsing Whymper to her, on walk, with any bitch pups to be hers and the dog pups his.

Since Whymper was by Walsing Watchmaker, a son of Glencannie Sonia, Mrs. Madden eagerly accepted. Whymper had a difficult whelping and only Mrs. Madden's skill and excellent attention saved the litter of three dogs and two bitches.

Having done a grand job of rearing, Mrs. Madden sent the three male pups home to Walsing and kept the bitches. One of them, Glencannie Picnic, was a good winner at the same National Terrier Club and Croydon shows where her brother, Winning Tricks, made such a sensational Best-in-Show debut.

Mr. Singleton also credits his wife, Blanche, with a vital part in Winning Trick's career. "She saved all our puppies through the last terrible winter," the Wizard of Walsing said. "My part in the business has really been small; the ladies did the biggest job."

The Scottish Terrier Club of America has finally gotten around to revising its awards of annual specials as the members at the annual meeting in February requested. The board adopted at its September 10 meeting a proposal I published in May, but with modifications, including the restriction of these awards to members only instead of to any breeder.

Beginning in 1948, the club will award annual trophies (value not stated) in three regions, as well as two national trophies. Divisions Nos. 1 and 2 correspond with the A.K.C. point divisions, and No. 3 combines the California and Pacific Northwest A.K.C. divisions. Specials for Nos. 1 and 2 will be awarded to the exhibitors residing and showing in each who obtain the highest point ratings in best of breed, American-bred dog and bitch and puppy dog and bitch. In Division 3, trophies will be given only for best of breed and puppies.

The club's Francis G. Lloyd Memorial Trophy for the dog or bitch winning the

greatest number of points in best of breed and the Edgerstoune Trophy (formerly the Mrs. John G. Winant Trophy) for the kennel winning the most best of breed points, not necessarily with the same dog, will remain national trophies, open to all members regardless of residence or area of competition.

The club announcement is not clear whether these trophies will be offered at all shows or only at hand-picked shows as in the past. Neither is it clear whether, in the event they are offered at all shows, the show must be a three-point, or better, show, or whether one- or twopoint shows would count if there was competition in a particular class for one of these trophies.

Neither was it made clear whether, in the event a show was three points (or better) in one sex but only one or two points in the other, if the higher point rating would be applied to both. Only those members residing and exhibiting in a region are eligible for a trophy and if a dog is jointly owned, all owners must be club members for the win to count. Wins in various classes will have the same point values as the A.K.C. point rating, as before, and competition between two or more entries of different owners is required.

The club also announced that the Winter Specialty would be held February 10, 1948, with the Associated Terrier Club show in the Twelfth Regiment Armory, Sixty-first Street and Columbus Avenue, New York, and that application would be made to the A.K.C. for this date. As Henry D. Bixby, A.K.C. Executive Vice-President, was present at this board meeting, I presume that this announcement will not be considered a violation of A.K.C. rules governing premature announcement of show dates.

Eng. Ch. Heather Beau Ideal has died at the age of 14 years. This noted sire was bred by his owner, James Chapman, and was by Eng. Ch. Heather Ambition ex Kiltane Echo.

Best of Breed was Ch. Barbary Knowe Rufus, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles C. Stalter, with Mr. and Mrs. Albert C. Ayres' bitch, Ayerscott Agile taking Best Opposite and Best of Winners. Winners Dog was Battison Beneficial, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Edward Danks; Reserves were Mrs. Edward H. Berkovitz' dog Victory Lad II and Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Icelows' bitch Cabrach Vivacious. The hard work of the Icelows, incidentally, was largely responsible for the fine turnout.

The Scottish Terrier Club of Kentucky is another organization that provided lavish prize money and trophies for its show, November 2, held with the Louisville Boston Terrier and Dachshund Clubs. T. H. Carruthers III judged. Prizes of \$25 each were provided, for example, for first in the novice classes, with similar prizes or trophies in each of the other classes. Best of breed got a \$50 aluminum airplane crate and a \$45 sterling silver bowl besides the perpetual sterling punch bowl usually offered.

Mrs. Stuart Frame, who has exported Dichards from her St. Quivox Kennels, St. Quivox by Ayr, Scotland, to many Countries, including America, died August 29, and her famous dogs are being sold. Mrs. Frame was very active in war charities, raising considerable sums for the Royal Air Force Benevolent Fund and the Red Cross. She had recently moved and was busy getting settled when she died unexpectedly.

The Riviera show held at Santa Monica, Calif., on September 7th, had 24 entries, and Mrs. George Ryall's Ch. Odd-Me-Dodd Piper was Best of Breed and third in the group. Mrs. Barton Scott's Sharyn O'Scotbart, the Winners Bitch was Best Opposite. Best of Winners was Wm. Huested, Jr.'s, Bothkennar Barleycorn.
