Scotties at the Shows

TOO MANY shows to report in detail this month, but we will give you the highlights. Major Point Shows have not been too numerous, but the breed has done very well in group and Best in Show winning.

The Hamilton, Mass., show on August 20th had an entry of 17 with Arthur P. Lund judging. The Jos. W. Kelleys had two of the Winners. Ch. Independent Ben was Best of Breed and his daughter, Kelscot Dream was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite. Best of Win-

The Sommerset Hills Kennel Club show at Far Hills, N. J., and the Westchester Kennel Club event at Rye, N. Y., were held on consecutive days—September 10th and 11th. There were entries of 16 and 18 respectively. Mrs. John G. Winant's Ch. Walsing Winning Trick was Best in Show at both events. At Far Hills with Mrs. Cecil Barber of England judging, Mr. and Mrs. Raymond J. Icelow's Amerscot Mistress Mary was Best of Winners and Best Opposite, with Miss A. Brownell's Bracloch's Glen-garry took the dog points. The next day at Westchester, Blanche E. Reeg's Blan-art Bramble was Best of Winners and Best Opposite with the Chas. C. Stalter's Barberry Knowe Warlord placed Winners Dog. Caswell Barrie judged the breed here.

The Reading, Pa., show on September 18th had an entry of 14, judged by Mrs. Seth G. Malby. Again it was Ch. Walsing Winning Trick of Edgerstoune for Best of Breed and Best Terrier; Blanart Bramble was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite, and the Chas. C. Stalters' Barberry Knowe Director was Best of Winners.

The Suffolk County Kennel Club show at Huntington, L. I., on September 24th had an entry of 19 judged by Mrs. Beatrice G. Vail. Ch. Walsing Winning Trick went through to Best in Show. Edw. F. Moloney's Gold Finders Gay Lassie was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite and Barberry Knowe Director Best of Winners.

The next day at the Westbury Kennel Association show at Westbury, L. I., Winning Trick, topped the entry of 18 judged by Derek G. Rayne and then went on to Best in Show. Goldfinder's Gay Lassie was Best of Winners and Best Opposite and Barberry Knowe Warlord took the dog points.

October 2nd was the date of the Middlesex County Kennel Club show at Auburndale-Newton, Mass., where there was an entry of 15, judged by Carey W. Lindsay. Mac R. Kennels' Ch. Rigadoon Jimminy was Best of Breed with Kelscot Solitaire placing Best of Winners and Best Opposite. Mr. and Mrs. Richard Heins' Mac R's Man of War was Winners Dog.

The Chicago West-Suburban show at Wheaton, Ill., on September 11th had an entry of 22, judged by Frank Ward. Marie A. Stone's Ch. Kinclaven Careless was Best of Breed and then won the Terrier group under John P. Hackett. Mrs. Stone really had a field day as she had all the top winners. Kinclaven My Bill was Winners Dog and Best Opposite and Kinclaven Ever Amber was Best of Winners.

There was quite a string of shows down Texan way during September, though the Scotty entries were quite

The next week at the Keene, N. H., show, where there was an entry of 16 judged by Ernest Crowley, Ch. Independent Ben not only topped the entry, but went on to win the group and Best in Show under Theo. Hollander. Mrs. W. Josten's import, Walsing Wyndola of Hampton Hill went from Open Bitches to Best of Winners and Best Opposite. The H. Alvin McAleenans' Bowery Emperor of Flornell of Vigal was Winners Dog.

Ch. Independent Ben was again Best Terrier at the Great Barrington, Mass., show on August 28th, where Mrs. Wm. Constable judged a breed entry of 10 and the group. Walsing Wyndola of Hampton Hill was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite and Bowery Emperor of Flornell of Vigal was Best of Winners.

THE point rating for Scottish Terrier Bitches for Division 2, West and South, has been changed effective October 1st. The new rating is 2-4-6-9-12. The only real change is in the requirements for three points which was formerly 7 and is now 6.

The famous Ch. Relgalf Ribbon Raider and about a dozen other well-known Scotties formerly shown under the colors of Mrs. J. Flagler Mathews' Relgalf Kennels, are now with the kennels' former manager, Russell Oppenshaw. The Oppenshaws moved to California some time ago and now operate the Belle Isle Kennels of North Hollywood.

Mrs. Winant's Ch. Walsing Winning Trick of Edgerstoune chalked up two beautiful Best in Show wins in late September—he was tops at both the Suffolk County Show and at Westbury the following day. Earlier in the month—on the 18th—he won the Group at Reading, Pa., show. In the last issue we mentioned Trick's Best in Show wins at Westchester and Sommerset Hills.

Statistical minded folks—and every breeder should be—will be glad to get caught up on Mrs. Spence's "Call of Champions" data. It's been missing for a month or two—vacations etc., just didn't leave time to compile the material.
